- ✔ Cross the road in front of the bus, only when the driver signals it's safe.

🚍 On the Bus:

- ✓ Stay seated while the bus is moving.
- ✓ Keep noise levels low and listen to the driver.
- ✓ Keep aisles clear and never throw objects inside or outside the bus.

Did you know? It is illegal for drivers to pass a stopped school bus with flashing red lights. Please help keep our students safe!

Literacy Tips: Reading with Your Child
