BLT Sr Principal Report, Presented by Mr. Craig Myra:

Student Success Planning

- Data will be collected at End of May to share with group at last meeting. Focus of collection will be to have baseline for September.

Grade 3 Provincial Assessment

- French Immersion Students write 2 days (2 Math)
- Setting students up for success
 - Question of the day in Math (Multiple choice)

- 3 Math coaches (2 ENG and 1 FI) supporting over half the staff.
- Literacy coach coming back in May to work with 3 teachers.

BLT Jr. Principal Report, Presented by Mrs. Janet Roy:

Staffing Update:

- -Principal Janice Wells will not be returning this year. She will be retiring at the end of June. Janet Roy will be continuing in the acting Principal role for the remainder of his year. The principal position was posted for the 2024-2025 school year and the successful applicant is Albert Williams. An invitation will be extended to Albert to attend our May SAC meeting.
- -We will be receiving our allocation for the 2024-2025 school year on May 6th.

Student Well-being Survey Results:

- Overall, the students seem to have fun at school, have friends, feel safe and know they can talk to an adult. Results of the survey give us the percentages for each category but not the "why" for the students' answers. For future surveys, when a student answers "sometimes" or "no", the teacher will make a note as to why beside the answer. This will help us when determining what supports to put in place.
- The reading question (6) was framed differently than the Math (7) and Writing (8) questions. "Do you like to read?" the results were much lower than when the question was framed "I am good at Math/Writing". So the students see themselves as Mathematicians and Writers. They were not asked the question "I am good at reading" just if they like to read. We will look at framing the questions the same for Reading, Math and Writing in the future.







Culturally Responsive Spaces Survey Results (Please see results below)

- Amanda Maher (CRP Specialist) and Jenna Fowler (Library Support Specialist) collected data from selected classrooms using a combination of surveys, Dotmocracy and conferencing to gather information about how students feel about the library space, capture their reading identity and how they felt about the book options available. Data was recorded and disaggregated, looking for patterns or trends.
- We started to add or make changes to the Library Space based on student input. This included the addition of a colorful rug for students to sit on, displaying culturally responsive books on lower shelves where students can access them, expanding book displays, new bulletin boards to display collaborative art displays, flags to represent Mi'kmaq, African Nova Scotian, and Acadian cultures. Teachers were presented with the data to reflect on and think about action steps that can be taken for their own classroom spaces. This supports our SSP well-being goal as we work to create more culturally responsive spaces within our entire school.
